Could the writer of this verse have been inspired by: "We have seen his star in the east and have come to adore the Lord" (Matt 2:2)?




The solemn blessing of the Epiphany liturgy offers Christians wishes that only Christ the light of the world can fulfill.

Council News

In a brief meeting on Thursday, December 17, Parish Council members voted unanimously to extend the Council's development budget to include support for ministry skills development of parishioners.

A proposal in support of prolife activities, presented by Patrick Cole and Lu Pillar, was referred to Family Life coordinator Ruth Mytty for possible inclusion in the Education committee's Family Life ministries.

Social Action committee presented a proposal for expansion of social justice programs and for the addition of two half-time staff members, one to serve the parish as "pastoral counsellor" in the area of social services and one as "social justice coordinator." The Council asked for feedback from other committees and staff and for clarification of position descriptions and of the financing required.

In other committee reports, Personnel recommended volunteers be sought to assist with telephone answering and other tasks under the parish secretary's supervision: Building and Grounds announced plans to install a safety handrail at the north door of the Parish Center; Education compiled and distributed a committee handbook to its members; and Social Action committed parish funds (\$100) in support of Project Good Start, which provides breakfast for youngsters who might otherwise not have any.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Thursday, January 21 at 7:30pm. All parishioners are welcome.
