





I would like to thank the Social Action Committee and the individual parishioners who contributed to my trip to Guatemala. The delegation, consisting of 11 people from the United States and 2 from Canada, spent the week of April 11 - 18 on its fact-finding mission. We had an excel-lent guide, Gloria Kinsler, who has lived for 13 years in Guatemala as a Presbyterian missionary.

During this week we met with members of Human Rights Commissions, lay church leaders, missionaries. professors, lawyers, labor union leaders, editors of various newspapers, etc. We also met with U.S. Ambassador Michaels, and his military economic and advisors, as well as one of the bishops from the Catholic Church.

The purpose of the trip was to study the impact of the Central American. Peace Plan and the "democratic opening" in Guatemala. We also studied the human rights situation in the country and possibilities for the refugees to return to Guatemala. I hope to give a presentation at St. Pat's in the near future to relay our findings to you.

At the May 19 meeting of the Parish Council, new members were warmly welcomed and seated on the Council: Pat Justice, Kathe Lehman-Meyer, Barbara Wysocki, and Bob Haessly. Outgoing members Audrey Brown, George Fahey, and Rita Weisiger were roundly thanked for their service to the Council and the parish.



In parting comments, Audrey urged the new members to plunge right in, to "get involved and speak right up from the very beginning. You all have gifts to share!" George remarked on how much he had learned about the parish while serving on the Council - and recommended that meetings somehow be streamlined as a real service to the members. Rita reviewed some of the highlights during her three-year membership, and said: "I loved the Council. I had a good time. I really tried to do my best."



Sister Rosemarie, who is leaving the council after serving 6 years as an honorary member, said "It's been a privilege to have been associated with St. Patrick's - such an alive and wholesome and holy People of God."



After the seating of new members, nominations and election of officers took place: Bill McClellan was elected President, Tom Kacich Vice-President, and Barbara Wysocki Secretary.



## Parish Council

In other matters reported and discussed. parish council committees continue The Worship to be active. Prayer Committee announced plans for an "appreciation party" for parish musicians in May, for servers in August, and for other liturgical ministers in the fall. The Social Committee (still in need of more members) is making arrangements for Memorial Day holiday coffee to be held in the parish center following the 9:00am parish Mass, which is to be celebrated this year at Woodlawn Cemetery. The Education Committee is seeking new members to fill vacancies.



Action Committee reported on three projects. They registered at the county jail to implement a ministry program there; they are planning a forum at which Sharon Dorsey, back from her fact-finding trip to Guatemala, can share some of her experiences and impressions; they have met with representatives of the Worship and Praver and Education committees in a dialogue for long-range planning on social-justice issues.



Building and Grounds The Committee reported that repair of the church roof will cost about \$2000. and that bids are being sought for replacement of drapes in the Parish Center class-All groups and rooms. individuals using Parish Center facilities are urged to exercise greater care in locking doors, turning off lights, and closing windows on leaving the building so that security will not be compromised.



George Fahey, co-chair with Shirley Splittstoesser of this year's diocesan Annual Stewardship Appeal, reported that pledges have reached about \$57,000., with roughly half that amount already paid. Many of the 450-500 pledge cards sent to parishioners have not yet been returned, so there is hope that the announced goal of \$60,000. may still be reached.



By unanimous vote, Fr. Remm authorized by was the Council to seek diocesan approval to acquire the property adjacent to St. Patrick's at the corner of Clark and Coler. According to the proposal, the present owner would continue to live there and would receive a down payment and monthly payments from St. Patrick's over a maximum period of 15 years for a maximum cost of \$50,250.



The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Thursday, June 16. All parishioners are invited to attend these open meetings.
