St. Patrick's parishioners are invited to enjoy a night of free ice skating at the University of Illinois Ice Arena on Monday, March 14.

Each Wednesday night session will begin with a prayer service followed by a presentation/discussion of the issue, ending with a time for fellowship.

The dates and topics for the Lenten Forum are: Feb. 24th: The Director of the East Central Illinois Refugee Mutual Assistance Center will present a slide show depicting the plight of Asian refugees in our world today. The Center has actively challenged and helped us in aiding Laotian refugee families to re-settle in Champaign-Urbana. Mar. 2nd: Sharon Monday-Dorsey, a member of our parish, will present "An Overview of the Texas Border and Immigration." Mar. 9th: Joe Ahearn will present information about the organization Bread for the World. Bread for the World is a Christian citizen's movement against hunger. Dur parish is a B.F.W covenant church. Come learn what that involvement can mean. Mar. 16th: David Onstad and Ken Southwood, members of the local chapter of Amnesty International, will speak about the organization and the work it does to protect human rights throughout the Mar. 23rd: Deminick Casadonte will world. present a slide show and discussion of the Catholic Worker Movement and will present specific ways of supporting our local Catholic Worker House. St. Patrick's has been an ongoing source of support to the Catholic Worker House since Fr. Dorsey began it in 1978.

The Lenten Social Action Forum meets in the Multipurpose Room at 7:00 p.m. each Wednesday evening. We hope you will make the Forum a part of your Lenten preparation for Easter.



Parish Council News



At their February meeting, Parish Council members reviewed and approved continuing programs for inclusion in the budget for the fiscal year 1988-89.

Among committee reports, Building and Grounds mentioned that the Health Department gave the parish kitchen high marks for overall cleanliness. Also noted, however, were areas calling for improvement: stove and hood must be more thoroughly cleaned after use, no homecanned foods may be stored there, and that absolutely no smoking is permitted in the kitchen.

Social Action agreed to provide matching funds (up to \$200.) for parishioner pledges in support of a committee member's participation in a task force to Guatemala to investigate conditions there. (See story this issue.) The committee is also planning an appreciation dinner for all parishioners who have participated in any activities directly or indirectly connected to social justice issues and concerns.

Communications recommended purchase of "desktop publishing" software for general use by staff, committees, and parish organizations in preparing documents, booklets, and brochures for use in parish activities and events.

Revenue will sponsor another financialplanning workshop. Worship and Prayer is planning the commissioning of ushers and servers. Personnel is reviewing duties of volunteer secretarial help. Finance will try to find ways to apportion next year's lower projected income among approved programs, whose funding needs are expected to be greater next year. Some difficult decision-making may be called for if the dollar-stretching magic isn't successful.

In response to the Long-Range Planning report, an ad hoc committee is to be formed to examine available programs that foster ongoing adult conversion of life, both as a substitute for the Christ Renews His Parish program (inactive here for the last 3 years) and as a follow-up for parishioners who have been motivated by CRMP and other activities to grow and develop spiritually.

Father Remm mentioned that parishioners nominated 9 men and women of St. Patrick's to be invited to the "l'm Waiting To Be Asked" vocational conference on March 20. Father also received notification of this spring's Annual Stewardship Appeal for the Diocese of Peoria. Our parish assessment for this campaign is about the same as last year's. He added that the job description for Pastorial Associate has been posted and given wide distribution, both in our diocese and elsewhere. He expects to interview applicants in late March and early April.

The Parish Council's election committee is seeking candidates from the parish for election to the Council. A minimum of 2 candidates for each of the pending 4 vacancies will be presented to the parish for the election, which is scheduled for April 16-17.

Dr. Rosemary Radford Ruether, noted feminist theologian and author of numerous works on social justice, Church history, and Christian theology, will speak at St. Patrick's Parish Center on Friday, April 15, 7:00 p.m. ~ 9:00 p.m. Her visit is sponsored jointly by the Education and Social Action committees of the Parish Council.

Br. Ruether's presentation, "Easter Hope for the Church," will be based on her recently published book Contemporary Roman Catholicism: Crises and Challenges (Sheed & Ward, 1987). In preparation for her presentation, the adult religious-education sessions on March 6, 13, and 20 will focus on this book. Guatemalan Fact-Finding Trip

Parishioner Sharon Monday-Dorsey hopes to be one of the participants in a group which will conduct an investigation in Guatemala. Selected by the Chicago Religious Task Force, the group will evaluate living conditions in the country, and assess the possibility for Guatemalan refugees to return to their homeland. The fact-finding delegation will meet with church, government, labor, humanitarian, and peasant leaders.

On their return, the members of the group will relay their information to their home communities and to Guatemalans in exile. A follow-up trip will be planned for November.

The Dorseys themselves have pledged to pay up to \$600. of the \$1200. cost of the trip and are seeking pledges from local organizations and individuals. The Social Action committee will provide matching funds (up to \$200.) for pledges from St. Patrick's parishioners. Pledges may be turned in to the committee chair, Gary Laumann, or left in the committee's mail box at the Parish Center.
